Dear Education Stakeholder,

On July 31, 2018, the President signed the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act into law. This bill – which reauthorizes the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006 (Perkins) and is more commonly referred to as Perkins V – is the federal regulation that supports secondary and postsecondary career and technical education (CTE) in Pennsylvania and across the country.

Under Perkins V, states have until April 2020 to develop a State Plan that outlines how the state will implement the new regulations and use federal Perkins funding.

## **Regional Meetings**

To ensure meaningful collaboration in plan development, PDE will host regional meetings to collect feedback from educators, business representatives, and communities. This feedback will assist the department in determining the direction for secondary and postsecondary CTE in Pennsylvania.

During this time, PDE will provide additional details about the Perkins V requirements and facilitate discussions around key policy decisions that will inform the plan.
