



We replaced outdated industry equipment with \$60,000 of state-of-the-art industry-standard equipment in the carpentry, automotive, electrical, and welding programs. The benefits of partnering with corporate partners and how this equipment was provided to our students will be discussed. This model did not only work at WMCTC but also at Pottstown High School and is currently working with Chester County Technical College High School-Brandywine Campus.

Greater Johnstown Career and Technology Center partnered with TEN to deliver \$17 million in facility improvements. The project scope includes major mechanical systems upgrades, new building automation systems, a facility-wide LED lighting upgrade and building envelope improvements, including a new roof. These improvements will reduce utility and maintenance costs, while immediately improving the learning environment for students and school staff. In addition, in the summer of 2023, TEN will begin construction of a 1 MW solar array that will offset GJCTC's electric utility cost.
